

RUSS TERROR REFUGEES FIND NEW HOME HERE

Once Wealthy Admiral and His Family in Peace at Camden

Years of war, turmoil, poverty, squalor and famine of Russia will be forgotten this afternoon by Madame Nascha Zaef, wife of Rear Admiral Zaef, when for the first time in years, she enters the unpretentious little house at 215 Pearl street, Camden, surrounded by her husband and three children, and once again has a place she may call home. Although the simple two-story house is a far cry from the pretentious palace in Nickolies, Russia, it will have much lacking in the tenements and hovels, in which the family was obliged to hide during the tempestuous days of Russia's changing government.

The family will be driven from Wynnewood, Pa., to Camden early this afternoon in a motor car belonging to Nicholas W. Akimoff, brother of Madame Zaef, at whose home the family have been stopping since their arrival in this country as refugees. The house will be shared with Miss Ella Hillman, its owner, who will retain several rooms.

Arrangements have been made to have the children enter a special class for foreigners on tomorrow morning. Admiral Zaef has not yet established connections with a business concern, and it was learned from Mrs. Akimoff that his first few weeks will be spent in enjoying the quiet of his new home. He was wounded while serving in the Imperial Russian Navy.
